PRIMARY, MEMBERSHIP, AND FELLOWSHIP TRAINING, EXAMINATIONS AND DESIGNATION IN THE WEST AFRICAN COLLEGE OF CLINICAL PHYSIOLOGY SCIENCES (WACCPS):

### Training Requirements/Examinations/Designation

### **Primary Examination**

The primary examination is the first step in the WACCPS's examination process. It assesses candidates' foundational knowledge in clinical physiology sciences.

- Eligibility: Candidates must meet specific requirements, including a relevant degree and completion of a certified training program.
- Examination format: The examination consist of multiple-choice questions, short-answer questions, and/or practical/clinical components.

### **Training Requirements for Membership Examination**

The West African College of Clinical Physiology Sciences (**WACCPS**) requires candidates to undergo structured training programs before sitting for the Membership examination. These programs may include:

### **Training Programs for Membership**

- 1) **Clinical Physiology Training**: Candidates must complete a recognized training program in clinical physiology sciences.
- 2) **Practical Experience**: Hands-on training in relevant clinical settings.
- 3) **Supervised Clinical Practice**: Candidates are required to complete a specified period of supervised clinical practice.

#### **Alternative Route for Membership**

Alternatively, candidates with significant experience in clinical physiology may be eligible to sit for the Membership examination. Requirements may include:

- 1) **Years of Experience**: A minimum of 5 years of experience working in a clinical physiology unit, with evidence of continuous professional development.
- Professional Development: Candidates must provide evidence of ongoing professional development, including attendance at conferences, workshops, and relevant training programs.
- Examination format: The examination consist of:
- Written components (e.g., multiple-choice questions, short-answer questions)
- Practical components (e.g., clinical skills assessment)
- Case-based discussions

## **Training Requirements for Fellowship Examination**

For the Fellowship examination, candidates are expected to have advanced training and experience beyond the Membership level. Requirements may include:

## **Training Programs for Fellowship**

- 1) Advanced Clinical Physiology Training: Candidates must complete advanced training in a specialized area of clinical physiology sciences.
- 2) Research and Publication: Candidates are required to conduct original research, publish papers, and present at conferences.
- 3) Leadership and Expertise: Candidates are expected to demonstrate leadership and expertise in their field, including mentorship, teaching, or other forms of professional service.

## **Alternative Route for Fellowship**

Alternatively, candidates with extensive experience and expertise in clinical physiology may be eligible to sit for the Fellowship examination. Requirements may include:

- 1) **Years of Experience**: A minimum of 10 years of experience working in a clinical physiology unit, with evidence of significant contributions to the field.
- 2) **Professional Achievements**: Candidates must provide evidence of significant professional achievements, including publications, presentations, and leadership roles.

- Certified Clinical Physiologist (CCP)

- Member of the West African College of Clinical Physiology Sciences (MWCCPS)
- Certified Specialist in Clinical Physiology (CSCP)

# 3. Fellowship Examination:

- Fellow of the West African College of Clinical Physiology Sciences (FWCCPS)
- Diplomate in Clinical Physiology (DCP)
